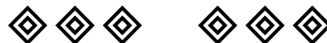

All other reading will be done from library or internet sources. Plan to provide a written record of your reading at the beginning of each class to avoid late penalties on that portion of your grade.

VIDEO: Sermons will be recorded on Webex and you will review your sermon with the instructor's comments in hand. Critique sheets must be filled out and turned in *by the next class* to avoid significant penalty to that sermon's grade.

SERMONS: Five sermons are scheduled during the semester. Time limits, types, and objectives vary as noted. Sermons must develop a biblical text or topic. Be prepared to hand in a typed or computer printout copy of your full-sentence outline *before* you preach, and your one-page, key word speaking outline *after* you preach. **DO NOT PREPARE OR SUBMIT A MANUSCRIPT unless specifically asked to do so!** If you know ahead of time that you will be absent on a day you are assigned to speak, schedule a make-up time with the professor *before* the class you will miss.

FINAL: The final will cover lecture material only (not the text).
