The seminary catalog describes the subject matter of this course as follows: "God's manifestation of himself and methods of theological studies; discussion of revelation, Word, inspiration, inerrancy, authority, and the methodology of theology." In this course you will become familiar with the orthodox and reformed views of natural and special revelation, the relationship by which God has revealed himself to mankind (covenant), the process and results of biblical inspiration, and the manner in which we understand the truth of God and that which he reveals to us. Topics (such as inerrancy) which are controversial today will receive special attention. The course will involve lectures, considerable reading, responses to direct questions, and a special project.

- Define and distinguish the various branches of systematic theology
- Effectively define and defend the orthodox doctrines of revelation and the word of God
- Defend the inspiration, infallibility, and inerrancy of Scripture

- Employ sound hermeneutical principles to the different sorts of biblical literature
- Identify and refute interpretations of Scripture based on false hermeneutical principles
- Identify the main historic and contemporary errors regarding the Scripture's inspiration and authority
- Demonstrate the covenant structure of biblical revelation
- Preach or teach on the subject of the Bible and revelation
- Pass ordination examinations dealing with the inspiration and interpretation of Scripture
